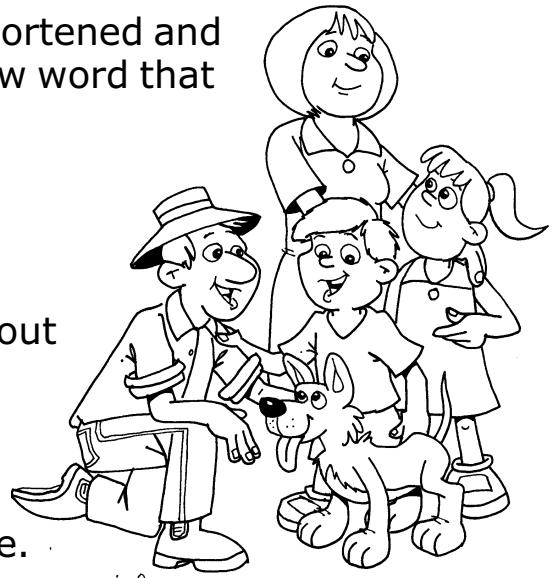
Crazy Contractions

Contractions are formed when words are shortened and combined with an **apostrophe** to make a new word that means exactly the same thing!

For example: **don't** is short for **do not**
I'll is short for **I will**
