A Dash of This and a Dash of That...

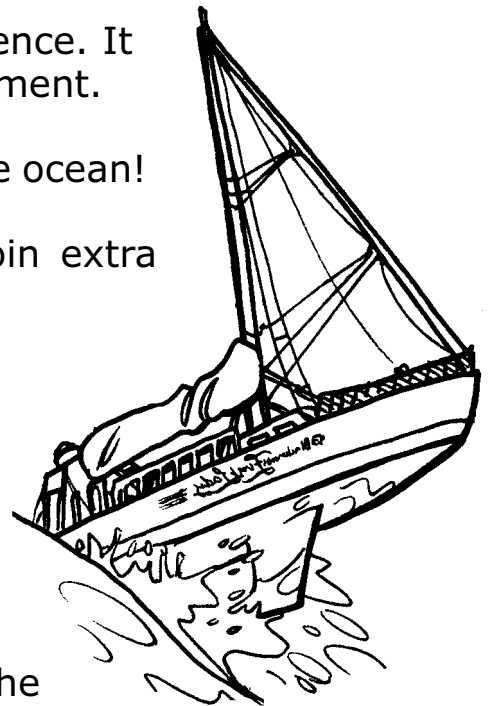
A **dash** is a short line used to break up a sentence. It usually adds extra information to a main statement.
